

#41 could be the James F. Akright's rosewood keyboard built for the Mears chime at Wesleyan Univ, Middletown, Connecticut. When Mears extended the original chime bells, Akright built this keyboard and a new bar transmission for the playing action. He also built a matching rosewood practice keyboard with tubular chimes. Present state of this work unknown to me.

Guidelines for Submitting Materials



GCNA Archives	ABCL Vertical Files
Materials related to the activities of the GCNA	Materials related to a particular instrument,
	individual, or foundry

Who Should Submit Materials?

GCNA Archives: Those in elected or appointed positions that include administrative responsibility for the work they undertake including; Board Members, committee/subcommittee chairs, liaisons to other organizations, editors of publications

ABCL Vertical Files: Anyone! Especially an individual responsible for a particular instrument and/or who has done research on a particular instrument, foundry, or individual

What Types of Materials to Submit?

Send files that, in your estimation, have or are likely to have historical value to the GCNA, to the record of a particular instrument, or to the carillon art in general. Send <u>2 copies</u> of primary documents, including born-digital files and essential secondary documents. For example, a program or recording of a performance is a primary resource, a history of or critique of the performance is a secondary resource. Having a program or recording autographed by the performer makes a nice artifact for the future.

Make sure your materials include: Who, When, and Where!

- A/V recordings	- A/V recordings

When to Submit Materials?

While there is no official timeline or time limit for submitting materials, it is recommended to create a "schedule" for yourself to encourage the habit of submitting materials regularly ie: at the end of a semester, year, or series season.

What Not to Submit:


Please do not send materials that are not carillon related or do not inform the history of an instrument, foundry, or individual with ties to the carillon community, or materials that are incomplete. For example, please do not send materials related to organs or bells which are single bells, a ring, peal, etc., a portion of a multi-page article, etc.



This *fabulous find* comes from the Centennial Exhibition which was held in Philadelphia in 1876 in honor of our country's 100^{th} birthday!

This stereograph* is of the Centennial Chime which was on display in the Machinery Hall of the Centennial Exhibition. It is a 13 bell chime and is the first known chime produced by the McShane Foundry of Maryland. It has since been moved and is now located at the Cathedral of the Incarnation in Garden City, NY.

First, I wanted to update you that the last mystery that was shared we believe with 99% certainty is a single bell located at St. Mary's Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Kingston, Ontario. Many thanks to Rick Watson for his help on this mystery! The nice folks at St. Mary's were grateful to have some information about their bell, as no one has even seen it in recent years due to the dangerous conditions to access it. The bell (which was cast by Petit & Fritsen and weighs approximately 4,700 pounds) is still in use by means of an electronic mechanism that is used to strike the hour, and for special occasions such as the election of a new pope.



Second, I wanted to also share another mystery/fabulous find! (yes — it is both a mystery *and* a fabulous find!) This one began, as they usually do, with sorting though materials in the course of our CLIR grant funded project. I came across this letter, which makes mention of film footage taken at the Taylor Bell Foundry.

Pince August 27, 1948 Mr. Frank Godfrey John Taylor and Company Loughborough, England Dear Mr. Godfreys It was a pleasure to have your letter of the 19th and to know that you will be in this country in September. We do hope you will plan to stop in Arm Arbor. College does not begin until the 20th, and I believe Percival Price's first recital of the fall semester is on the 26th of September. He gives a recital twice a week at least and may increase this number to three a week. We are not quite certain about the schedule for the fall semester. I do know the Dean of the College of Fine Arts at Lawrence, Kansas, namely, Donald M. Swarthout, and am only too happy to write him on your behalf. I quite agree with you. I don't see what the good would be of a sminging bell on a low D. There is even a question in my mind whether it would be of sufficiently good quality to match up with the other bells of the carillon. You know that the lower you go the greater the chance is of getting an excellent quality of bell. I have a feeling that the two low bells in the Rockefeller and the University of Chicago carillons are not as useful as they might be if the quality of each of them were better. I will see that we have the copy of the moving picture film ready for you. I will see that we have the copy of the moving picture film ready for you. We have not made a copy of it as of this time but have kept your impression of it in the larger reel and if it isn't possible for Eastman to give us good copy in this short time, take our entire reel along to Lawrence with you. I showed the film recently for the meetings here in Ann Arbor of the North American Guild of Carilloneurs. They were delighted with the photography which you secured in the foundry. It was the first time that most of them had ever seen anything like it. I'll talk with Price about the matter and perhaps he will write you. In any case, I hope you can stop off on your way to Lawrence as well as on your return from there. I understand that Mr. E. Deniston Taylor died recently. You are the only one, I believe, still with the firm who was there when I was. Am I right in assuming that the young Mr. Taylor whom I met, namely, Denison's nephew, was killed in the last war? with warm personal greatings in which Mrs. Moore joins, I am, As ever yours, Earl V. Moore EVM:15 Dean



The label on the photo reads "Carillon for the R.C. cathedral Los Angelos (sic) California".

The inscription on the bell reads:
"Ad Majorem Dei Gloriam
Pope Pius XII Gloriously Reigning
Joseph Anthony O'Sullivan Archbishop of Kingston
J. Andrew O'Neill, Rector of this Cathedral
Gerald Hanley, James P. Sullivan, J.Reid Powell
Arthur Welsh, Joseph J. Brennan: Assistants"

Joseph Anthony O'Sullivan was the Archbishop of Kingston, Ontario, Canada from 1944 to 1966. Pope Pius XII served as Pope from 1939 to 1958.


